

San Fernando Valley Registry Week – August 29 to September 2, 2011

The 100,000 Homes Campaign is an effort to find and place the most vulnerable, long-term homeless individuals into permanent housing by July 2013.

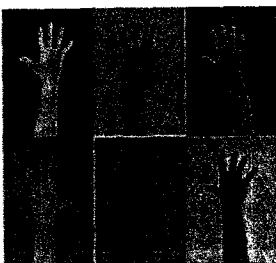
The **San Fernando Valley Homeless Coalition** is working with Community Solutions (cmtysolutions.org) to hold a registry week in the San Fernando Valley communities of **North Hollywood and Sun Valley**. The goal of the registry week is to create a by-name registry of homeless individuals living in shelters and homeless encampments. Homeless individuals will then be prioritized based on those who have been on the street the longest and who are identified as being the most vulnerable.

We are confident that our efforts will help to end chronic homelessness in the San Fernando Valley *one placement at a time*.

The Homeless Registry will take place from 4-6 a.m. on the mornings of August 29, 30, and 31.

We need approximately 70 volunteers to work the registry. Volunteers will be placed in teams of four and each team will be assigned to a selected area in Sun Valley and North Hollywood. Teams will identify homeless persons and conduct a short survey.

- **Provider agencies** participating in the registry week include LA Family Housing, Northeast Valley Health Corporation, San Fernando Valley Community Mental Health Center, Inc., Tarzana Treatment Center, Chrysalis, and People in Progress.
- **Volunteer for the Registry Week** – Community members are especially encouraged to participate; be part of the solution to ending homelessness.
- **Volunteer Training** – Sunday, August 28, from 2-4 p.m. at the Valley Shelter (7843 Lankershim Blvd., North Hollywood, 91605).
