Families within the NENC boundaries attend GHCS. It is imperative that parents be kept up to date on the status of this investigation and the steps being taken to ensure their children's safety.

Additionally, Judy Diamond will make contact with Granada Hills South Neighborhood Council to inform them of our proposed resolution and to find out if they are taking any action.

12. Update on the motion passed by the NENC Education Committee: The Northridge East Neighborhood Council is concerned about dangerous traffic conditions on Plummer St. and Praire St. and other streets around our local schools including Dearborn Elementary Charter Academy and Oliver Wendell Holmes Middle School. We call on the city to increase enforcement of traffic and parking laws and to fully fund the crossing guard program to help protect students traveling to and from school safely.
