 - a. CD 12 (Myrka Martinez); Ms. Martinez spoke about copper wire theft. There will be a reduction of speed limits on some streets. The are about 15 in CD12. The Extended Stay in Northridge will be a Project Home Key site. Councilmember Lee has introduced a motion to assist the Department of Animal Services with their intake and care of injured wild animals. Another resolution that has kind of been resolved, was in opposition to the Community colleges districts plan to petition the US Supreme Court to eliminate foundational portions of the Americans with Disability Act and the Rehabilitation Act. The Councilman has introduced a resolution to support that would expand the definition of Gravely Disabled and a resolution in support of lowering price per gallon gas. The first batch of kale has been harvested from the first ever indoor Pod Farm. This was in partnership with the DWP. Southern California Edison Gas Company put forward it's Angeles link plan that would create the US largest green hydrogen energy system. That would help and the need for natural gas and how those ties to us is that it would help one of the Councilmember's priorities. Which is to end the region's reliance on the Aliso Canyon Natural Gas Storage Facility. John and Michelle Hales asked about The Extended Stay America and if they will be removing the Section 8 residents currently there. Kathleen Edwards from NWNC wants to know why community members are not being heard.
