 - a. Presentations on the Wilkinson Senior Center (8956 Vanalden Avenue, Northridge)
 - i. ONEgeneration Director Rhonda Bunnin (weekday services and programming)
 She is the operator of the weekday programs for OneGeneration. They currently have 637 members enrolled in their program. The hours are Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:00PM they have activities such as: art classes, yoga, exercise classes, Bingo, group discussions, dancing, and watercolor. They offer lunch every day, but you need to register at 10:30 AM. Lunch is served between 11:30AM and 12:30 PM. They also offer virtual programming, and have mental health and case management services.
 - b. Recreation and Parks Recreation Facility Director Jonathan Sanchez (evenings and weekends)
 Recreation and Parks owns the facility and does programming on evenings and weekends. The vision is to provide affordable recreational, physical, and cultural opportunities with a focus on families, youth development, and healthy communities. They also hold events. They are currently reseeding the park and dealing with the gopher holes. Sports classes and registrations are down to \$10.00. They are being funded by The Olympic Committee to get kids to participate in sports. The Senior Dance will be held.

- c. CSUN reports and updates Shefali Mistry and Golden Bachelder
 - i. Orange Grove Bistro building demolition scheduled between 11/27/2023 to 1/15/2024 Shefali Mistry- January 17,2024 is the 30th Anniversary of the Northridge Earthquake There is a Dance Company, Diablo that will be doing a commemorative piece at CSUN. They are working with the City Council and the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors to do some type of presentation. They are also planning other events. Ms. Mistry is working with the community group that will be bringing an expo and film screening about the earthquake on January 20th. School starts on January 20, 2024. The CFA will be joining the Teamsters in striking from January 22-26. This will be a rolling strike and is not expected to be at the CSUN campus. CSUN has about \$380 million dollars, worth of capital expenses on campus. Maple Hall should be opening in the Spring (Sierra Annex). They will have a basic needs suite at the University Student Union after securing \$6 million dollars in the state budget. It will provide Counseling Services, The Food Pantry and Maddie's Closet. On April 4, 2024 there will be a fundraising gala honoring Jolene Kester, who was previously the President of CSUN and

more recently the Chancellor of the CSU system.
