  - a. John Hales-Mr. Hales spoke about the new 311 App. There were a lot of problems when it was released. To access 311 you need to download the new 311 app. They city is working on the issues.
  - b. Michelle Hales-wants to speak to the State Representative in regards to the Balcony Bill. They are being charged \$4,500.00 by one of the condo complexes to weather proof and a simple fix to the rail.

There is a mural being painted on Lahey St. the same day in Granada Hills so it will be a busy Saturday. That is all of April. Upcoming in May we have our Making Movies that Matter and we also have AAPI day of service. We are also working to put together a defense class at Wilkinson. More details will be shared soon. We know that you know that homelessness is still one of the biggest issues that our city is facing. We need to get more of the individuals inside. Councilmember Lee presented the motion to oppose SB79. One of the other motions is to raise the brush clearance boundary around homes from 500ft. to 700ft. Another was a resolution to oppose any weakening of the Hazardous Waste. Disposal Regulation. The county has ended its relationship with LAHASA, The Councilman is trying to figure out what the city needs to do next and to see if things need to be moved in house.
